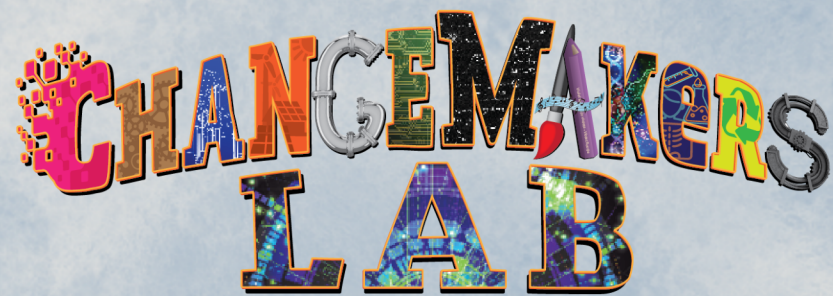

During our High School week, we had one camper who was drawn so close to the Lord that he is now starting to discern priesthood. During our Junior High camp, we had a camper who would often be found in the chapel sitting beside the tabernacle because he just wanted to “spend some time with Jesus.” One camper in the High School week said that she was significantly impacted by Adoration and “experiencing sisterhood” for the first time. There are youth from the Camp who have started altar serving at the Church because they first started at the Camp. When planning the Camp, we wanted to intentionally connect the campers with the Parish community so that they can find a place and answer the call to participate in the life of the Church when the Camp ends.

We saw that the Camp was a beautiful opportunity for the youth to have a personal and tangible experience with the Lord and build life-long friendships. As someone whose personal faith journey was jump-started by a profound experience at a summer camp, it is one of the greatest blessings and joys in my life to be able to offer this to the youth of our community for hopefully many more years to come.
