Lent has two major purposes: It recalls or prepares for baptism and emphasizes a spirit of penance. For the six weeks of Lent we are in the desert *preparing* for new life - the resurrection. Baptism is when we first *encounter* new life with Jesus. Therefore, we will not celebrate baptism during Lent as we are *preparing* for baptism. We will resume celebrating baptisms on Easter Sunday.

Ash Wednesday & Good Friday:***Universal days of fasting & abstinence from meat***

The law of abstinence from meat binds those who are 14 years of age and older; the law of fasting binds those who are 18 to 59 years of age. We are invited to limit ourselves to one ordinary meal (perhaps more simple than usual) and much simpler meals at other times. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are good days to make an effort to refrain from snacking. The Church does not encourage a "black fast" - eating nothing. Fasting is never intended to harm your health! (If you are pregnant, nursing your child, or have a medical condition which would be affected by fasting, please continue with what you ordinarily do.) The purpose of fasting is to learn to discipline ourselves and to be in solidarity with so many around the world who have much less.

Rite of Election Mass, February 22nd, 1:00 pm

St. John the Baptist Cathedral, McLennan
Archbishop Charles Duval, CSsR will preside at this Mass welcoming catechumens and candidates. All are welcome. Catechumens will be received into full communion with the Church this Easter through the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and the Eucharist. Candidates (those already baptized in another faith tradition) will be received into the Catholic Church and confirmed at the Mass on the Feast of St. Joseph. A light lunch will be served afterwards.
